Her debut record for E1 Music (formerly Koch Records) titled *Revolutionary Rhythm* features an eclectic mix of American works for piano and was released nationwide on March 24, 2009.

“Music for Autism is committed to raising public awareness and improving the quality of life of individuals with autism and their families through music,” says Robert Accordino. “We sponsor interactive concerts, specifically tailored to be ‘autism-friendly’ and to enrich the lives of those with autism. The kick-off party concert will be our first in Houston, and we look forward to continuing our fully subsidized programming in the Houston area in the years ahead.”
